

JEFFREY

Three areas at Jeffrey Energy Center (JEC) have been designated wildlife management areas, and a fourth area has been designated as the Oregon Trail Nature Park. A map showing the following areas is on the back of this publication. The only access to the Wildlife Area 2 is through main entry gate at the Jeffrey Energy Center. There is a guard posted at this gate 24 hours a day. Individuals wishing to hunt or fish

must leave a photo I.D. with the guard, sign a log book, obtain a copy of the regulations and map and a colored badge that must be visibly worn. At least one individual in the hunting or fishing party must be 18 years of age or older.

Waterfowl hunters will be issued brown badges, upland game hunters will be issued orange badges, and anglers will be issued blue badges. Badges shall be used in lieu of written permission

required for access to Area 2. Game and fish will be counted upon departure. A \$10 fee will be charged for lost badges. The number of people allowed to fish or hunt on Area 2 at any one time will be limited. Seventy-five percent of available admissions shall be filled by the general public. Twenty-five percent shall be filled by utility employees.

JEC FISHING REGULATIONS

1. Fishing is permitted only on the designated lakes.
2. No swimming is allowed.
3. All boats must obey state boating laws.
4. Maximum speed for all boats is 10 miles per hour.
5. Fishing hours are sunrise to sunset.
6. Fish cleaning on site shall be limited to the removal of entrails. No heads or tails shall be removed. The entrails shall be disposed of in the lake.

7. Statewide rules and regulations apply. All special JEC regulations are posted at boat ramps.
8. All fish caught that do not meet minimum length requirements must be returned immediately to the water.
9. Ice fishing is prohibited at Jeffery Energy Center.
10. Fishing at the JEC Make-up Lake is open year-round. Fishing at the Lower Auxillary Lake is closed from the first day of duck season to March 15.

WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA 1

This area is available to the general public with uncontrolled access for hunting and fishing. All Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks regulations apply. Unit #1 is open to trapping.

WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA 3

This area has been designated a wildlife refuge and hunting, fishing, and public access are prohibited.

AREA 4 OREGON TRAIL NATURE PARK

The Oregon Trail Nature Park showcases the natural eco-systems of Kansas, and borders the historic Oregon Trail along its southern edge.

The park has two ponds and three nature trails: the *Sea of Grass Trail*, *Natural Neighbor Trail*, and *Pond Trail*. The trails show the beauty of the Kansas prairie, wildlife, ponds and streams, and woodlands. A silo at the site showcases and original mural by local artist Cynthia Martin featuring immigrants traveling the Oregon Trail, a Native American buffalo hunt, and wildlife.

The park also has a shelter house and amphitheater. The area is open dawn to dusk, seven days a week.

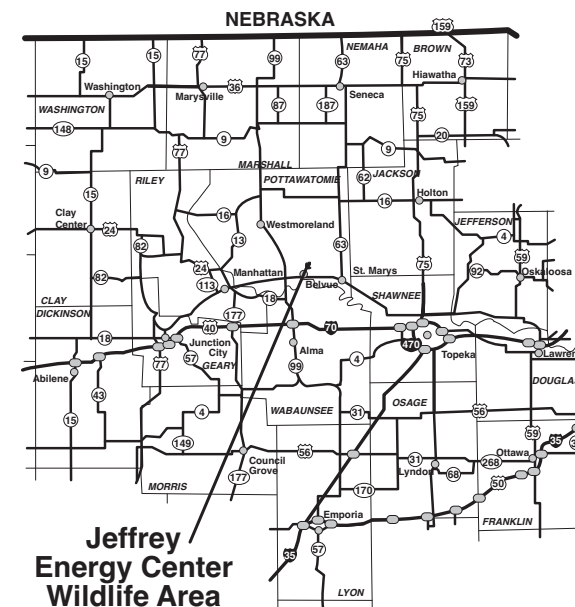
THINGS TO REMEMBER

Vehicles must stay on marked roadways. All other roadways are restricted to employees. All-terrain vehicles are not allowed. Speed limit is 20 miles per hour unless marked otherwise. PLEASE observe and obey all signs and notices.

Consumption of beer or other alcoholic beverages is prohibited.

Take your trash with you. DO NOT LITTER!

It is recommended that you call the guard house before traveling to Jeffrey Energy Center (JEC) to hunt or fish. JEC will close public access when national security levels are raised.

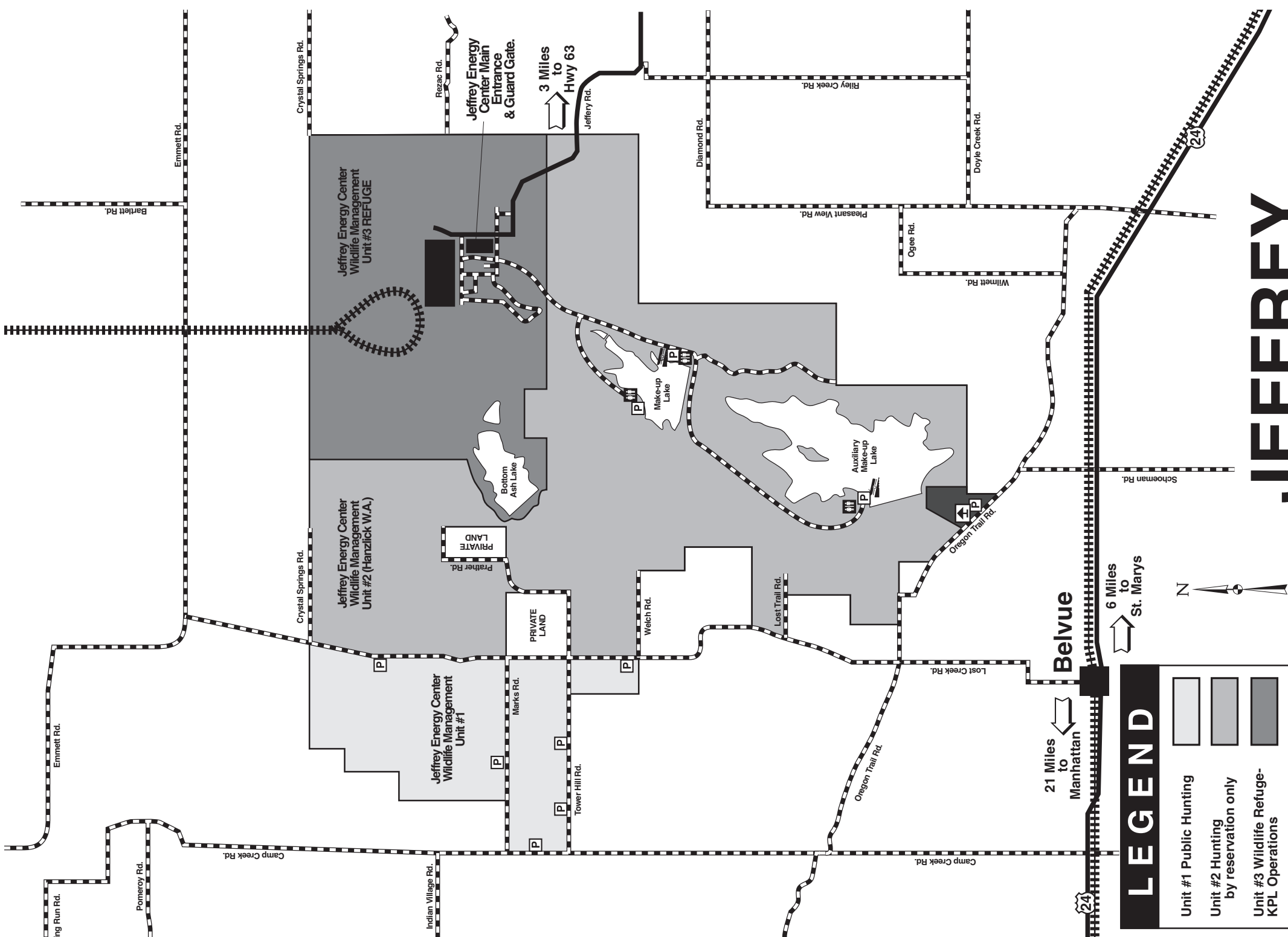
